## SCHOOL RULES

We expect that students will treat one another and the staff of the school with respect, and that they will conduct themselves in such a manner that learning can take place in a comfortable and safe environment for everyone at Peacock Collegiate.

### HARASSMENT POLICY

Moose Jaw Public School Division No. 1 is committed to providing a safe, positive work and learning environment where everyone is treated with respect and dignity. Harassment in the workplace and schools is unacceptable and against the law. It will not be tolerated in any form. Harassment is defined as any unwanted conduct that offends or humiliates. It may be verbal, physical, visual or psychological. Any complaints under this policy should be addressed to the offending person or to one of the school administrators.

### DISCIPLINE AND SUSPENSION

1. Reasons for office detentions: a) skipping/truancy  
b) no shows for classroom detention  
c) other administrative reasons
2. Days/Time-Monday, Wednesday, Friday 12:20-1:00; Tuesday, Thursday 3:25-4:05.
3. Students will have a choice of serving the next noon or after school session.
4. Students shall bring homework or a book to read (no magazines, walkmans). Work will be assigned by the detention teacher if required.
5. Classroom detentions will be given at the discretion of the classroom teacher and each teacher is responsible for supervising his/her own students.
6. Suspensions-May be in-school or out-of-school. Students suspended out-of-school will be required to return with assignments completed.

### SMOKING

Note: Effective September 1998 there will be no smoking allowed on the campus of AE Peacock Collegiate or the streets and boulevards adjacent to the school.

1. For the 1997-98 school year, students under the age of sixteen(16) years will not be allowed to smoke on campus or the streets and boulevards adjacent to the school.
2. Students between the ages of sixteen(16) and eighteen(18) years will be required to have a phone call from a parent to the principal or vice-principal for permission to smoke on campus. Such students will then be issued a card which must be on the person to be allowed into smokers alley.
3. No smoking will be allowed during class time. Students are not to be in "smokers alley" for any reason during class time. Students who have spares are to spend their time either in the library, the lounge, a supervised area in the school or away from the school. No loitering is allowed in the foyer or stairwell area.
4. There will be no congregation of students on property in the vicinity of the school for the purpose of smoking.

### SWEARING

Swearing in the hallways classrooms or at staff will not be tolerated. The nature and severity of the swearing will result in disciplinary action within the Education Act.

### FIGHTING

1. Students who are fighting shall be sent home immediately with a one (1) day suspension.
2. They will return with their parent/guardian and completed assignments.
3. They will meet with administrative staff and/or students who were involved

## SUBSTANCE USE/ABUSE

1. If a student is considered to be under the influence of alcohol or drugs during the regular school day or extra-curricular activities, the parent/guardian will be contacted, the student sent home and a referral to Addiction Services will be required before returning to class.

2. Moose Jaw public School Division Policy, Regulations and Procedures will be in effect in dealing with substance use and abuse.

## LUNCH ROOM/NOON HOUR/FOOD

1. Before and during school hours food and drinks are restricted to the student lounge.

2. The upper two floors, except for the library, are off limits to all students from 12:15 until the 1:00p.m. bell rings.

3. Each student shall be responsible for putting his/her garbage in the containers so that the lunchroom is kept clean and can be used by others.

4. Slurpees, Big Gulps, any open cup drinks and sunflower seeds are not to be brought into the school.

5. Students abusing these rules may lose their privileges to stay in the building during lunch hour.

## SCHOOL EQUIPMENT

Students who are assigned desks, lockers, books and other equipment are responsible for the cost of repair or replacement of such items which are damaged.

Students are asked to use only lockers assigned during registration. Students are accountable for maintaining a clean and functional locker. Locks must be purchased at the school office.

Students should not share locks or lockers or reveal their combination to anyone and should be sure the lock is properly secured after use. Lockers remain the property of the school authorities have a right and responsibility to examine lockers for reasons of health, safety and security.

## DRESS

Students are to maintain an acceptable standard of dress in school and in class. Clothing with offensive language or gestures is not acceptable.

Footwear is to be worn in the school. Footwear which marks the floor is to be removed and left in lockers. Acceptable alternate footwear is to be worn in instructional areas.

Students are not to wear hats in the school. During warm weather, appropriate shorts, shirts and footwear are to be worn.

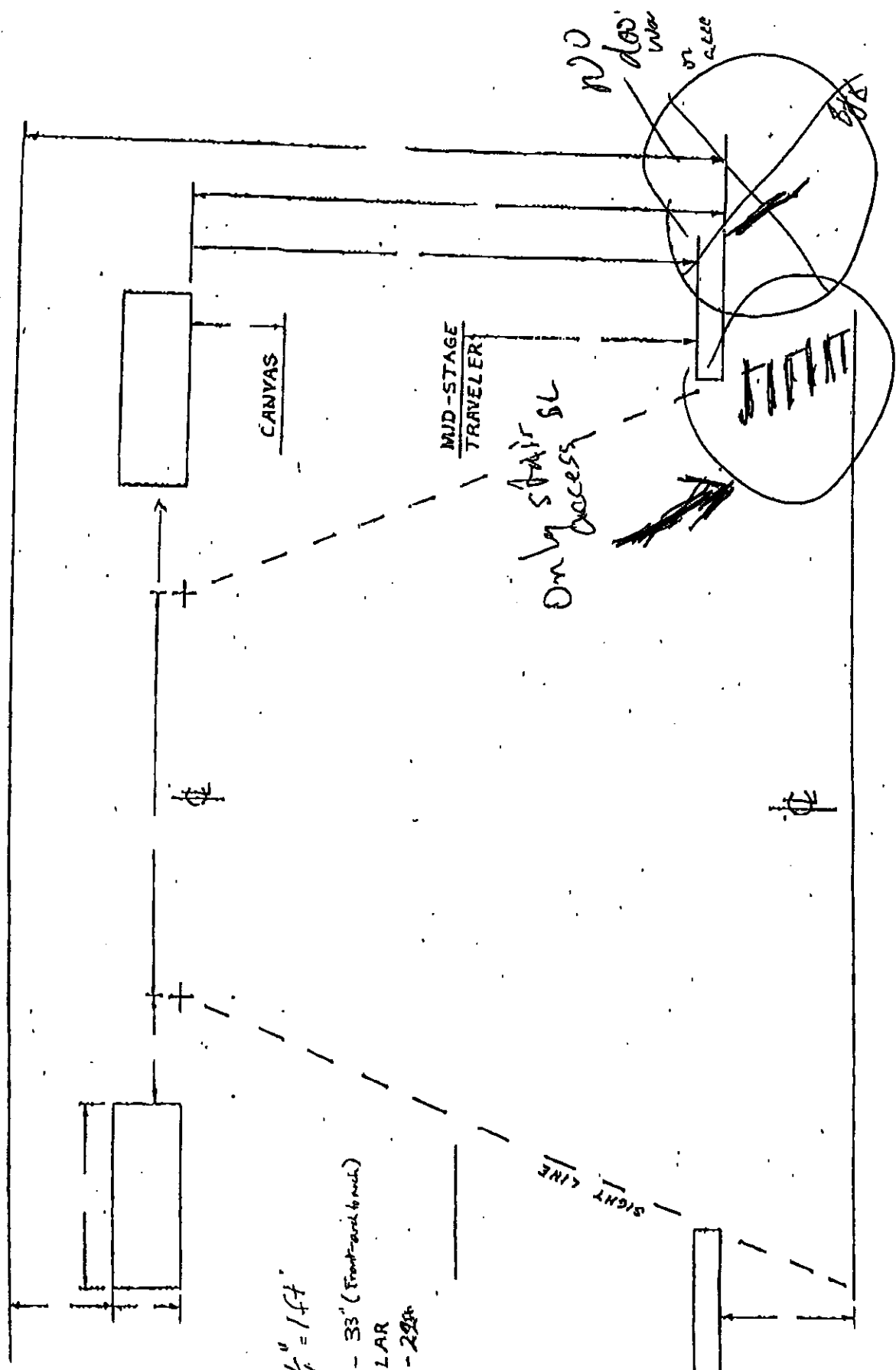
## POSTERS

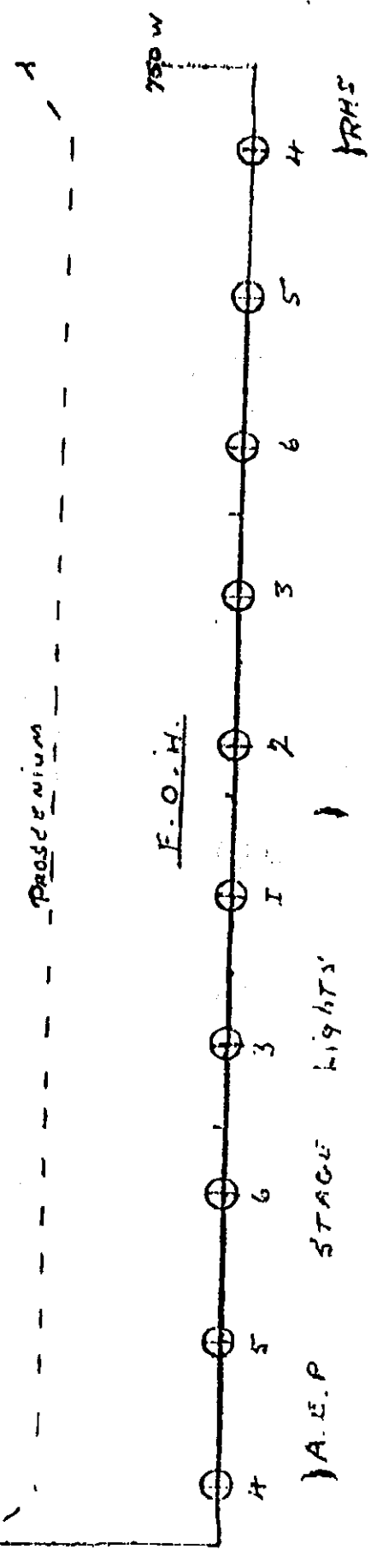
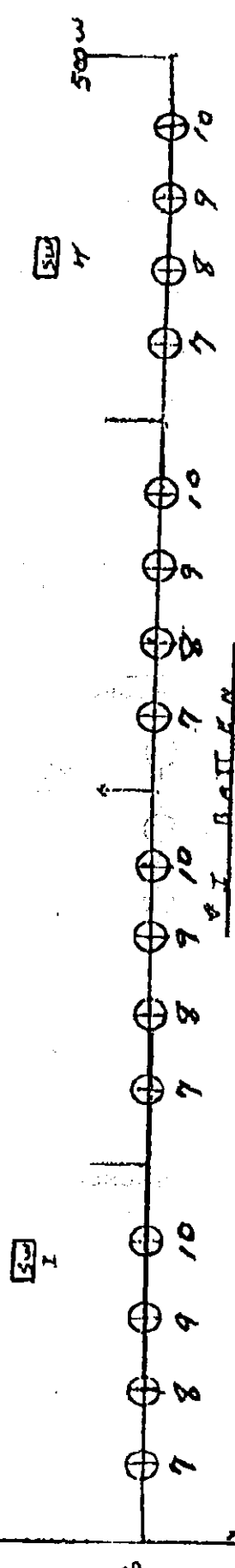
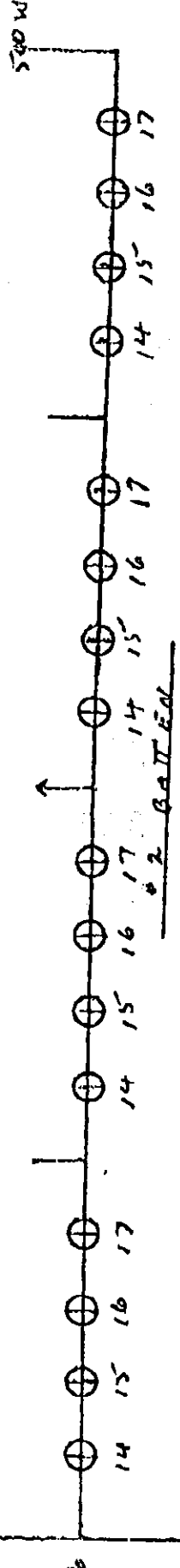
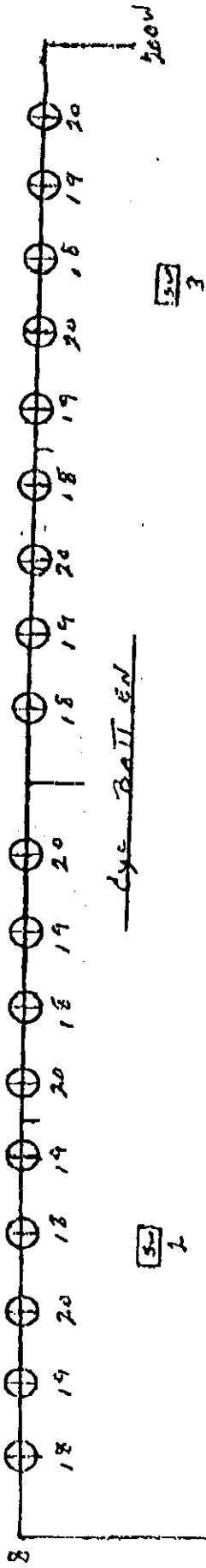
